17	management deadlines if and when the parties elect to pursue settlement efforts" (Doc. 70			
18	at 7), the current request does not fall within the letter of that rule and the Court concludes,			
19	at any rate, that the parties' request should be granted given the somewhat unusual			
20	circumstances here. However, the relief being granted is not a "stay." Instead, all			
21	unexpired case deadlines are simply extended by 60 days.
